Tulsa Pharmacist Benjamin P. Allison Honored for Outstanding Community Service

WASHINGTON, DC – The Oklahoma Pharmacists Association (OPhA) has selected Benjamin P. Allison, PharmD, as the recipient of the 2017 Bowl of Hygeia Award for outstanding community service. Allison was presented the award at the 2017 OPhA Awards Luncheon on Saturday, June 24. The Bowl of Hygeia is sponsored by the American Pharmacists Association Foundation, the National Alliance of State Pharmacy Associations, and the American Pharmacists Association, with support from Boehringer Ingelheim.

Allison has contributed to his community since graduating from the University of Oklahoma College of Pharmacy in 2002. He began his career at Consumers Pharmacy in Muskogee in 1976, and returned to his hometown of Afton in 1979, where he owned and operated Allison Drug until 1981. Allison later moved to Vinita where he serves as independent pharmacy owner of Osborn Drug.

Allison is a member of the Oklahoma Pharmacists Association, having served as president from 2005-2006. He is also a member of the American Pharmacists Association and is the district director for the American College of Apothecaries. Throughout his career, Allison has been involved in his community and has served as a board member at Craig General Hospital, the Vinita area Chamber of Commerce, and the Craig County Red Cross. He is a past president and Paul Harris Fellow of the Rotary Club of Vinita and has also served as fire chief for the Afton Volunteer Fire Department.

Established in 1958, the Bowl of Hygeia Award recognizes pharmacists who possess outstanding records of civic leadership in their communities and encourages pharmacists to take an active role in the affairs of their respective communities. The award is presented annually by participating state pharmacist associations, including those in the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico. In addition to service through their local, state and national pharmacy associations, award recipients have devoted their time, talent and resources to a wide variety of causes and community service.

The Bowl of Hygeia is the most widely recognized international symbol for the pharmacy profession and is considered one of the profession's most prestigious awards. The Bowl of Hygeia has been associated with the pharmacy profession since as early as 1796 when the symbol was used on a coin minted for the Parisian Society of Pharmacy. The bowl represents a medicinal potion and the snake represents healing. Healing through medicine is precisely why the pharmacy profession has adopted the Bowl of Hygeia symbol.
