

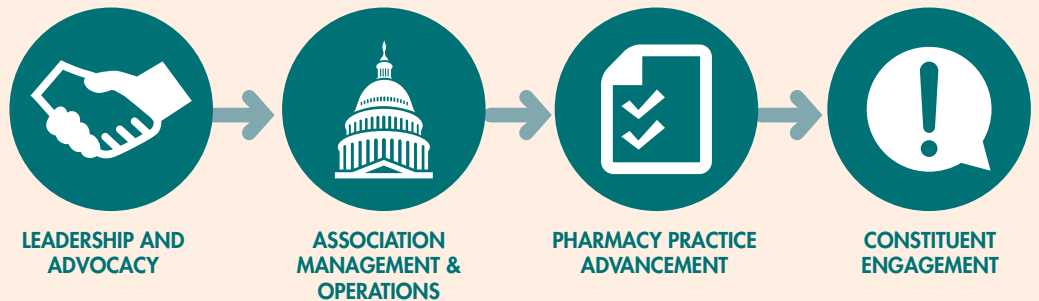
# Executive Residency in Association Management & Leadership

Initially started as a joint venture between APhA and NCSPA, the residency program aims to train pharmacy graduates for leadership positions. Thanks to a pledge made by the Knowlton Foundation in 2008, the APhA Foundation Executive Residency in Association Management & Leadership was reestablished through the Knowlton Center for Pharmacist-Based Health Solutions.

## QUALIFICATIONS & SELECTION OF THE RESIDENT

- Graduate of an Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Education (ACPE) accredited college or school of pharmacy
- Recommended by present or former employers, preceptors, college faculty, or dean
- Selection of the resident shall be the responsibility of the APhA Foundation Executive Director through a selection committee

## DEADLINES:

Apply online by **December 31, 2018**. Applicants will be notified of the selection committee's decision no later than **February 2019**.
