Meriden, Connecticut Pharmacist, Gregory L. Hancock, Honored for Outstanding Community Service

Washington, DC – The Connecticut Pharmacists Association (CPA) has selected Gregory L. Hancock as the recipient of the 2013 Bowl of Hygeia Award for outstanding community service. Hancock was presented with the award during the Annual New England Pharmacists Convention, September 19-20, 2013. The Bowl of Hygeia is sponsored by the American Pharmacists Association Foundation and the National Alliance of State Pharmacy Associations with support from Boehringer Ingelheim.

Hancock graduated from the University of Rhode Island in 1984. He is currently the owner of Hancock's Pharmacist and Surgical Inc., Hancock Pharmaceutical Services and Hancock Realty. He has been a member of numerous organizations over the years such as the Meriden Chamber of Commerce, the American Society of Consultant Pharmacists, CPA, National Association of Retail Pharmacists and the Masonic Lodge organizations. Hancock is also an active sponsor sponsorship of local organizations, including law enforcement, school programs and sports organizations.

Over the years, Hancock has received several awards including the Midstate Behavioral Health Systems Friendship Club Award of Excellence, Meriden Chamber of Commerce Business Expansion Foresight Award, Sphinx Temple Appreciation Award for Outstanding Support and the Xavier High School Hall of Honors Award.

Established in 1958, the Bowl of Hygeia Award recognizes pharmacists who possess outstanding records of civic leadership in their communities and encourages pharmacists to take active roles in the affairs of their respective communities. The award is presented annually by participating state pharmacist associations, including those in the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico. In addition to service through their local, state and national pharmacy associations, award recipients have devoted their time, talent and resources to a wide variety of causes and community service.

The Bowl of Hygeia is the most widely recognized international symbol for the pharmacy profession and is considered one of the profession's most prestigious awards. The Bowl of Hygeia has been associated with the pharmacy profession since as early as 1796 when the symbol was used on a coin minted for the Parisian Society of Pharmacy. The bowl represents a medicinal potion and the snake represents healing. Healing through medicine is precisely why the pharmacy profession has adopted the Bowl of Hygeia symbol.
