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Appleton Pharmacist Terry K. Maves Honored for Outstanding Community Service

Washington, DC – The Pharmacy Society of Wisconsin has selected Terry K. Maves as the recipient of the 2014 Bowl of Hygeia Award for outstanding community service. Maves was presented with the award at the President’s Reception and Awards Banquet on Saturday, August 23. The award is sponsored by the American Pharmacists Association Foundation, the National Alliance of State Pharmacy Associations and the American Pharmacists Association with support from Boehringer Ingelheim.

Maves has been a senior pharmacist at Shopko Pharmacy in Appleton, WI, since January 1997. He has also served as a pharmacy consultant at United Healthcare-Wisconsin since 2012. Prior to his current senior pharmacist position, Maves served as a staff pharmacist and chief pharmacist at two other pharmacies, Director of Pharmaceutical Services at Touchpoint Health Plan, and Pharmacy Director-Wisconsin at United Healthcare.

Maves has served in a variety of appointed positions, including examiner of the State of Wisconsin Pharmacy Licensing Board from 1998-2009, member of the Board of Directors of the Fox Cities Community Health Clinic from 2007 to present, member of the Novartis Pharmacy Benefit Report Advisory Board from 2008 to 2011, and member of the Advisory Board of the Appleton School District Career Academy for Students from 2008 to present. He has also served as a member of the Wisconsin Health Care Committee under Senator Kathleen Vinehout from 2008 to 2010 and member of the University of Wisconsin School of Pharmacy Board of Visitors from 2010 to 2011. He was appointed as a member of the Pharmacy Examining Board for the State of Wisconsin under Governor Scott Walker in February 2014.

Maves has been elected to the church council of 1st English Lutheran Church, the Board of Directors of the Wisconsin Health Information Exchange (2009-2013), and the Board of Directors of the Pharmacy Society of Wisconsin (2005-2012), of which he served as chairman from 2011 to 2012. He also served as president of the Pharmacy Society of Wisconsin from 2010 to 2011, and currently serves as chairman of the Board of Directors of the Fox Cities Community Health Clinic.

His awards include Drug Topics Honor Roll of Outstanding Chain Pharmacists in August 1996, Wisconsin Innovative Pharmacist of the Year, presented by the Pharmacy Society of Wisconsin, in August 2000, Outstanding Achievement in the Profession of Pharmacy, presented by Merck Human Health Division, in August 1996 and November 2002, and “Badger Making a Difference in Fox Valley Community,” presented by the Wisconsin Alumni Association, in October 2011.

Established in 1958, the Bowl of Hygeia Award recognizes pharmacists who possess outstanding records of civic leadership in their communities and encourages pharmacists to take active roles in the affairs of their respective communities. The award is presented annually by participating state pharmacist associations, including those in the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico. In addition to service through their local, state and national pharmacy associations, award recipients have devoted their time, talent and resources to a wide variety of causes and community service.

The Bowl of Hygeia is the most widely recognized international symbol for the pharmacy profession and is considered one of the profession's most prestigious awards. The Bowl of Hygeia has been associated with the pharmacy profession since as early as 1796 when the symbol was used on a coin minted for the Parisian Society of Pharmacy. The bowl represents a medicinal potion and the snake represents healing. Healing through medicine is precisely why the pharmacy profession has adopted the Bowl of Hygeia symbol.
