**Yarmouth, Maine Pharmacist, Paul B. Chace, Honored for Outstanding Community Service**

**Washington, DC** – The Maine Pharmacy Association (MPA) has selected Paul B. Chace as the recipient of the 2013 Bowl of Hygeia Award for outstanding community service. Chace was presented with the award during the MPA Fall Convention, September 6-8, 2013. The Bowl of Hygeia is sponsored by the American Pharmacists Association Foundation and the National Alliance of State Pharmacy Associations with support from Boehringer Ingelheim.

Chase graduated from the URI College of Pharmacy and has practiced pharmacy in Maine for over 20 years. He is currently is a regional recruiter for Rite Aid Pharmacies. He and his wife previously owned Old Port Pharmacy in Portland, Maine. He was appointed by Governor Baldacci to the Maine Board of Pharmacy as the Independent Pharmacist representative. He was reappointed by Governor LePage to the Maine Board of Pharmacy as the Chain Pharmacist representative in 2010. He currently serves as Vice President of the Board of Pharmacy. Chase has served on many working groups for the state of Maine including reports on “Prescription Drug Labeling Requirements” and “Pharmacy Robberies.” He is an active member of Maine Pharmacy Association, a speaker at past MPA conventions and supports pharmacy events at MPA, University of New England and Husson University.

Established in 1958, the Bowl of Hygeia Award recognizes pharmacists who possess outstanding records of civic leadership in their communities and encourages pharmacists to take active roles in the affairs of their respective communities. The award is presented annually by participating state pharmacist associations, including those in the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico. In addition to service through their local, state and national pharmacy associations, award recipients have devoted their time, talent and resources to a wide variety of causes and community service.

The Bowl of Hygeia is the most widely recognized international symbol for the pharmacy profession and is considered one of the profession’s most prestigious awards. The Bowl of Hygeia has been associated with the pharmacy profession since as early as 1796 when the symbol was used on a coin minted for the Parisian Society of Pharmacy. The bowl represents a medicinal potion and the snake represents healing. Healing through medicine is precisely why the pharmacy profession has adopted the Bowl of Hygeia symbol.
