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FINAL RESULTS FACT SHEET

(based on participants that met inclusion criteria for financial analysis)

Aggregated data was combined from participating employers in all ten Diabetes Ten City Challenge (DTCC) cities, reporting on 573 participants who had Baseline and Year 1 medical and pharmacy claims through December 31, 2007, and two or more documented visits with pharmacists. They had an average of 6 pharmacist visits and 14.8 months in the program. Analysis compared initial and most recent clinical data collected during patient care visits with community-based pharmacists for participants meeting inclusion criteria.

Economic Outcomes (573 participants)

Average total health care costs per patient per year were reduced by \$1,079 when compared to projected costs if the Diabetes Ten City Challenge had not been implemented.
